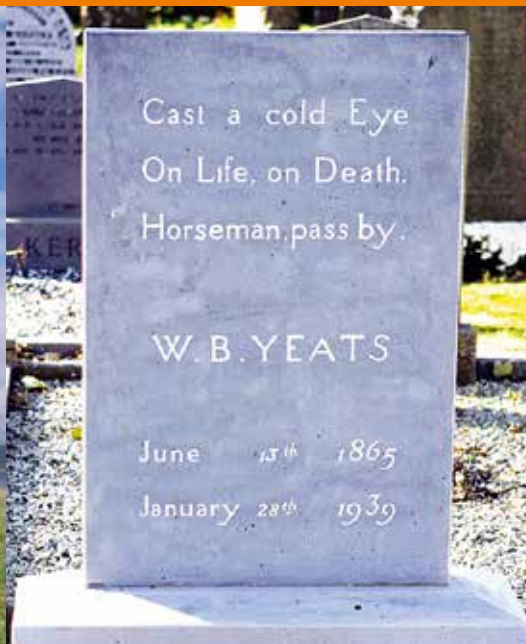

Duration:

Two years part-time

Accreditation:

NUI Galway Level 9

Programme Structure:

Monthly seminars run Friday night, 6-9pm, Saturday, 9am-5pm.

Year 1 (September-May)

- Concepts, Sources & Methods in Historical Studies (10 ECTS)
- Local History (10 ECTS)
- The Irish Land (10 ECTS)
- Ireland in the 20th Century (10 ECTS)
- Preserving the Past (5 ECTS)

Year 2

- Advanced Research Methods (15 ECTS) (September-December)
- Dissertation (30 ECTS) (January-July)

Awards:

- Students with 30 ECTS can graduate with a Postgraduate Certificate
- Students with 60 ECTS can graduate with a Postgraduate Diploma
- Students who complete the programme are awarded a Master in Arts degree

Entry Requirements:

- A primary degree (min H2:2) or evidence of equivalent academic achievement
- Applicants without the above but with relevant personal / professional experience will also be considered for admission

Who Should Apply?

It will be of interest to anyone currently practicing history or aspiring to practice history in the public domain, especially in the heritage sector, public institutions, museums, libraries, archives and schools. It will also appeal to graduates and teachers seeking continuing professional development opportunities and those who have completed study in a related field. The transferable nature of the skills acquired will be valuable to people from a wide variety of professional backgrounds.

Future Prospects:

Opportunities will exist in the heritage industry (museums, heritage centres and organisations, tourism agencies and enterprises), lecturing, rural development, research, archives and libraries, among other areas.

- €2,900 per calendar year for two years (€5, 800 for MA award) plus €40 booking fee. Payment can be made each year in two equal installments
